It further develops an understanding of the elements of art and develops expressive painting techniques It also includes the option of clay work following on from the year 10 vase</p>	<p>How it links to what will be studied:</p> <p>This project develops students' understanding of the formal elements of art-colour, line, tone, shape and form, pattern. It will teach them how to develop painting skills with freedom and confidence. Also how to develop their own independent ideas responding to a theme or stimulus.</p>
