Discrimination against the Jews 1933-1939. The SS Einsatzgruppen in Eastern Europe. The final solution.</p>	<p>How it links to what you have studied before: Causes of WW2 can be seen as a legacy of WW1, which we studied in Year 8. The Holocaust links directly to Civil rights in the USA due to the Nazis use of segregation of Jews. Students studied segregation in the USA during their civil rights topic.</p>	<p>How it links to what you will study: We will study the War in Vietnam. This is a part of the Cold War which is a consequence of the collapse of the Grand Alliance at the end of WW2. Furthermore this links to the Atomic bomb topic as it was the start of the Arms race. This topic also links to GCSE where you will do a depth study of Nazi Germany.</p>
